ORDER BELOW EXH-1

The matter is now fixed for final arguments of the parties. Herein the accused filed pursis Exhibit-164 and 166 and submitted that all the 13 matters transferred to this Court are required to be decided analogously. They stated that the evidence has to be recorded simultaneously, hearing has to be conducted simultaneously and the Court may pronounce a common judgment or different judgments at same time. This has been objected by the prosecution and learned APP submitted that this matter has reached to the final stage and can be concluded independently.

2. I have heard both the sides. Learned Advocate for the accused relied upon the order dated 24.07.2025 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the observations therein. It is stated that,

*"4. It is informed that the cases which were transferred to Mumbai have been placed for hearing before three courts. In this regard, it is suffice to observe that while transferring all the cases, our intention was to decide those cases by one Court/Judge. As such, these were transferred to 47<sup>th</sup> Court, Esplanade, Mumbai. In this view of the matter, we request the High Court to place all these cases before one judge/court to decide analogously by passing the judgment. We further request that in all the cases trial program indicating the list of witnesses/date of examination if not filed be submitted and the same be supervised as per the instructions issued by the High Court. We believe that*



*all the cases be decided within extended time of two years as prayed."*

3. So far the accused are stressing that this matter cannot be singled out and cannot be decided independently than the others. It was also stated that all the matters have similar facts and they need to be decided simultaneously. I have gone through the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court and it is clearly directed that all the matters have to be placed before one Judge/Court to decide analogously by passing the judgment. These directions and the word used 'analogous' shows that all the matters need to be decided simultaneously at one time and not by segregating them and by passing orders on different dates. Indeed this matter has reached to the final stage of arguments, but hearing them and deciding this matter independently will not be in accordance with the directions.

4. This Court, however, does not accept the submissions of the accused that all the matters are similar. Every matter transferred to this Court has different nature of offences and they are coming from different parts of India. The only similarity is the accused in all matters and the sections of offences. So these submissions do not hold any water.

5. However, as there are specific directions to decide all these 13 matters analogously, this one matter cannot be decided independently. Hence, this matter be kept along with others on the stage of final arguments and it will be heard along with other matters.
